

**BEIJING 2008 PARALYMPIC SUMMER GAMES**  
**Athletics Canada**  
**SCHEDULE 'B'**

**ATHLETICS – TRACK & FIELD**  
**PARALYMPIC SELECTION CRITERIA**

**SECTION I – INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 Schedule 'B' of the CPC/Athletics Canada selection agreement represents the internal nomination procedures of Athletics Canada. These criteria, along with Schedule 'A' and Schedule 'C', set forth the method by which Athletics Canada will determine its Paralympic Team nominations for submission to the Canadian Paralympic Committee (CPC). Therefore, if Athletics Canada qualifies for entry in the Beijing Paralympic Summer Games in accordance with International Federation (IF) rules and regulations as outlined in Schedule 'C', athletes nominated by Athletics Canada to the CPC for membership on the 2008 Canadian Paralympic Team must be those who:
- i. Have met the Paralympic Selection Criteria in Schedule 'A'
- AND
- ii. Qualify for nomination in accordance with Section II of Schedule 'B' entitled "**ATHLETICS CANADA INTERNAL NOMINATION PROCEDURES**".
- 1.2 **Athletics Canada may nominate to the CPC up to the maximum number of athletes permitted by Paralympic entry regulations in each event, and overall, subject to points 1.1 i and ii above.**
- 1.3 The final qualification date is **midnight, July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008**. Paralympic team nominations must be submitted to the CPC no later than **July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2008**.
- 1.4 Once the CPC accepts those athletes nominated by Athletics Canada according to 1.1 i and ii above, it is up to the sport to decide the actual athletes to be entered in the specific events at the Paralympic Games (see Section III below). The CPC reserves the right to not enter an athlete in an event for which he or she has not qualified.
- 1.5 Athletics Canada, in collaboration with the CPC, may produce an addendum to Schedule 'B' to clarify the terms of Schedule 'B' or to address other issues which may have been overlooked initially or have unexpectedly arisen. However, only in the event that both CPC and Athletics Canada agree on a change will any change be made to Schedule 'B'. Athletes will be informed by Athletics Canada of any such changes made to Schedule 'B'.

## **SECTION II – ATHLETICS CANADA INTERNAL NOMINATION PROCEDURES**

- 2.1 In cases where the number of athletes who have met Schedule ‘A’ criteria is equal to or less than the maximum entry, those athletes who have met Schedule ‘A’ criteria will be nominated to the CPC by Athletics Canada.
- 2.2 In cases where more than the maximum of allowable entries qualify, the following will apply:

### 2.2.1 Team Nomination Process

The purpose of the Team Nomination Process is to provide a fair process by which athletes are selected to the Athletics Team representing Canada at the Beijing Paralympics in 2008. At the same time, this process is also meant to provide a means of recognizing excellence and podium potential.

The Selection Committee will overview the selection process based on the objectives in the Selection Standards and name the athletics team by July 1st, 2008.

Currently, the Canadian quota stands at nine (9) athletes following Canada’s results at the 2006 IPC World Championships in Assen. An increase in the Canadian quota, based on 2007 Canadian results and rankings, is expected to be determined and announced by the International Paralympic Committee Athletics Technical Committee by February 2008. In anticipation of this quota, the following will be the process for nomination to the Canadian Athletics Team competing in Beijing in 2008.

### 2.2.2 Standards

2.2.2.1 Three standards will be used in the selection of athletes (see Appendix A). Athletes meeting, or surpassing, the Elite standards in at least one event will be selected first. Those athletes meeting or surpassing the CPC Schedule A standards will be selected second. Athletes meeting or surpassing the IPC B standards will be selected third.

**NOTE:** The standard must have been met or surpassed in:

a) An outdoor competition: Track and field and marathon standards must be achieved on an IAAF certified track and field facility and certified course, respectively. Wheelchair racers cannot use performances obtained on the Warm Springs, Georgia track.

AND

b) In an event that is sanctioned/approved by the National or IPC levels: “Nationally sanctioned” means those competitions sanctioned/approved by the National athletics/track and field organization, the National

Paralympic Committee or the National Disability specific organization (in Canada, USA, etc.). In Canada this includes provincial, regional or local meets sanctioned by Athletics Canada and Paralympics Ontario, for example.

During the qualification period (March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 through July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 inclusive), an athlete must compete in a minimum of two (2) IPC approved competitions. The list of current approved eligible National sanctioned and/or IPC approved competitions, found in Schedule 'A', identifies the competitions in which standards must be attained.

The IPC quota given to Canada will represent the number of athletes that will be nominated. The process of filling the quota will be as follows:

#### 2.2.2.2 Those athletes meeting or surpassing the Elite and CPC Schedule A Standards

The order or progression of selection will be from First Priority to Sixth Priority, with those athletes meeting the First Priority being selected first.

- a. **1<sup>st</sup> PRIORITY:** Those athletes having met or surpassed the Elite standard in at least one event, two or more times from January 1<sup>st</sup> 2008 to the July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 deadline, will be selected first (if quota permits).
- b. **2<sup>nd</sup> PRIORITY:** Those athletes having met or surpassed the Elite standard in at least one event, two or more times from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 to the July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 deadline will be selected second (if quota permits). The Elite standard must be achieved at least once in 2008.
- c. **3<sup>rd</sup> PRIORITY:** Those athletes having met or surpassed the Elite standard once and the CPC Schedule A standard twice in at least one event from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 to July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 will be selected third (if quota permits). One of the CPC Schedule A standards must be met in 2008.
- d. **4<sup>th</sup> PRIORITY:** Those athletes having met or surpassed the CPC Schedule A standard in at least one event, two or more times from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 to July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 will be selected fourth (if quota permits).
- e. **5<sup>th</sup> PRIORITY:** Those athletes having met or surpassed the CPC Schedule A standard in at least one event, two or more times from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 to July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 will be selected fifth (if quota permits).
- f. **6<sup>th</sup> PRIORITY:** Those athletes having met or surpassed the CPC Schedule A standard once and the "B" standard twice in at least one event from

March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 to July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 will be selected sixth (if quota permits). One of the “B” standards must be met in 2008.

#### 2.2.2.3 Developmental Athlete/Rising Star Criteria

If the number of athletes nominated using the nomination priorities outlined above in clause 2.2.2.2 DOES NOT exceed the quota allocated to Canada by the IPC, the remaining quota of athletes will be nominated using the Paralympic “B” standards. Nomination will be based on the following criteria (the Note outlined in clause 2.2.2.1, above, applies):

Athletes who have not competed at a Paralympic Games before and who are considered to have been identified as developmental/rising star athletes as a result of performances in 2007 AND who have met or surpassed the “B” standards twice in at least one event from March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 until July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008. One of these times to meet this standard must be achieved in 2008. Nominations will be made by the Selection Committee which will evaluate each athlete on the basis of the individual athlete’s performance(s) relative to its closeness to the CPC Schedule A standards.

#### 2.2.3 Tie – breaking process

In order to comply with the Canadian quota, it may be necessary to break a tie at some point within this nomination process.

- a. **More than three qualifiers in a single event in one class.** A maximum of three competitors may be selected for a single event. Where there is a necessity to break a tie when there are more competitors qualifying in one event in a single class and the priorities described above cannot break that tie, the tie will be broken by using the same tie-breaking system as described in 2.2.3 b.
- b. **More than the athlete quota in the last priority.** Where there are more athletes qualifying at the lowest qualifying priority level in order to meet the athlete quota, qualification will be achieved by using a formula measuring the best performance of the athlete with the standard of the appropriate scale for his/her event. The higher score will be ranked first. For track events, the standard will be the numerator and the performance the denominator x 100. For field athletes, the standard will be the denominator and the performance the numerator x 100.

Example 1: In the following examples, athletes qualifying according to Priority #5 are being considered in relation of selection to quota slots.

Person A's best performance in male T54 100m is 14.90sec. The CPC Schedule 'A' Standard is the appropriate scale for Priority #5 and the standard for this event is 14.95 seconds. The score for Person A is  $14.95/14.90 \times 100 = 100.4$  points.

Person B's best performance in the female T37 100m is 14.50. The CPC Schedule 'A' Standard for this event is 14.97seconds. The score for Person B is  $14.97/14.50 \times 100 = 103.0$  In this case, Person B is ranked ahead of Person A.

Example 2: Person C puts the shot 13.79m in the F37 event. The standard for Priority #5 is the CPC Schedule 'A' Standard. The standard for male F37 shot is 13.55m. Person C's score is  $13.79/13.55 \times 100 = 101$  points.

Person D throws the discus 20.59 in the female F35 discus. The standard is 20.59. Therefore her score is  $20.59/20.59 \times 100 = 100$  points. Person C is ranked ahead of person D.

**Note:** If one athlete had to be selected from these four athletes in the above examples, Person B (103 points) would be selected as the highest ranked athlete in the group of athletes.

#### 2.2.4 Athlete selection to other events

A maximum of three (3) athletes per NPC are allowed to be entered in each individual event at the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games. Once an athlete has achieved the CPC Schedule A Standard and has been nominated to the team, the Selection Committee will review that athlete's eligibility for other events. A minimum of the "B" standard must have been reached in order to qualify for any additional event(s). Athletes who have reached a higher standard for any particular event(s) will be selected ahead of an athlete achieving a lower standard. The final decision on that athlete's participation in the event(s) will occur after consultation with the athlete and his/her coach.

#### 2.2.5 Athletics Canada National Championships (July 3-6, 2008)

The National Championships will be used as a fitness test event for athletes who have qualified for nomination to the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games.

#### 2.2.6 Medical or Injury Exceptions

- i. In the situation where a selected athlete is injured prior to the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games, the Selection Committee will monitor this athlete relative to a healthy and full recovery to competitive readiness prior to the

Games. If a substitution is necessary, the Selection Committee will make the appropriate substitution nomination. See Section 2.3 below.

- ii. In the case of an athlete who was injured or was recovering from an injury during the qualification time period (March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 – July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008), this athlete could appeal to the Selection Committee for special consideration. The athlete in question must have submitted a performance standard that meets the CPC Schedule A standard at least once during the qualification period. The Selection Committee will review the athlete's past performances, current level of fitness and competitive readiness, as part of the final decision.

#### 2.2.7 Post-Nomination

All athletes nominated to the team to compete at the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games will be personally informed by a representative of Athletics Canada within two weeks after the nomination.

#### 2.2.8 Training Preparation Review

- i. The Head Coach will review all yearly training and competition plans which are on file in the office of Athletics Canada for carded and/or Road to Excellence funded athletes. Where there is a lack of clarity regarding final preparation for the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games, the athlete or coach will be contacted with the purpose of reviewing final preparations.
- ii. Where there have been significant changes to a plan which is on file, the athlete or coach will report these changes to the office of Athletics Canada.
- iii. If there is no yearly training and competition plan on file for the athlete, the athlete and coach will submit a signed (by both athlete and coach) preparation training plan and send to the office of Athletics Canada. This plan will be reviewed for clarity and appropriateness by the Paralympic Team Head Coach.

- 2.3 If an athlete who has qualified in an individual event is injured, that athlete may be replaced, subject to the Athletics Technical Committee (ATC) of the IPC and Paralympic regulations, by the next ranked individual athlete who has met all required selection criteria (Schedules 'A', 'B' and 'C'). Athletic Canada's team doctor will assess any injured athletes and determine if they are unable to compete.

- 2.4 Wildcard Provision. Athletics Canada will only be eligible to apply for wildcard entries to the Beijing Paralympic Summer Games for those athletes who have met all required selection criteria (Schedules 'A', 'B' and 'C') within the official Beijing Paralympic Summer Games qualification period established by the IPC.
- 2.5 Athletes with a demonstrated Paralympic performance history who, for unforeseen circumstances, are unable to meet the Schedule 'A' qualification criteria may be nominated by AC to the CPC for the consideration of the CPC Games Committee. Unforeseen circumstances include but are not limited to medical reasons, personal emergency, or bereavement. These circumstances must be clearly documented before the qualifying event in question and must be supported by a member of the AC's medical team or by another AC approved equivalent before the AC will submit the nomination for the consideration of the CPC Games Committee. In addition, Athletics Canada must submit supporting documentation with their nomination demonstrating:
- a) that the athlete has been examined by the Athletics Canada medical team and cleared to return to competition
  - b) that the athlete will have sufficient preparatory time and a formalized training plan in order to be in peak competitive condition at the time of the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Summer Games
  - c) a summary of the past four years of the athlete(s) rankings and results, and the athlete(s) recent results during the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Summer Games qualification period in order to demonstrate the probability the athlete would have been capable of achieving all required Selection Criteria (Schedules 'A', 'B' and 'C') if not for the exceptional circumstances.
  - d) any other supporting information deemed relevant by Athletics Canada.

The CPC Games Committee is the sole and final authority in determining if an exceptional nomination under this clause will be accepted.

### **SECTION III – ENTRY AT THE PARALYMPIC GAMES**

- 3.1 Once the final nomination list from Athletics Canada is accepted by the CPC, all athletes will have equal status as qualified Paralympic Team members.
- 3.2 Athletes nominated in their respective events by Athletics Canada to the CPC will be entered in those events at the Paralympic Games. Upon arriving on-site at the Games, the Athletics Canada Paralympic Coaches and the Team Leader will provide the final confirmation of an athlete's participation in each of their individual and relay events and will make any required entry changes.

**SECTION IV – ATHLETE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT**

All potential Paralympic Team members are required to read, sign and return the attached Athlete Acknowledgement and Acceptance form (Schedule ‘D’) to Athletics Canada.

**SECTION V – APPEALS TO ATHLETICS CANADA INTERNAL NOMINATION PROCEDURES**

Any dispute with regard to nomination of Paralympic Team members to the CPC will be pursued through Athletics Canada’s established appeal procedure outlined in the Athletics Canada athlete agreement (attached).
